<sup>1</sup> Must maintain a 3.80 GPA, to be reviewed at the end of spring  
<sup>2</sup> quarter. Recipient may also receive Leadership Awards if eligible, but not the Achievement Scholarship or Out-of-Area Grant.  
<sup>3</sup> 100% of tuition for years 1 and 2 (6 quarters); 50% for years 3 and 4 (6 quarters). Subsidy and President's Scholarship cannot exceed the cost of tuition and housing.  
<sup>4</sup> Recipient may also receive Leadership Award, the Achievement Scholarship and the Out-of-Area Grant, if eligible.

## Out-of-Area Grant

## Scholarships for Transfer Students

While transfer students are not eligible for the freshman scholarships listed on the previous page, they are eligible for the following scholarships:

SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNTS FOR TRANSFER STUDENTS	
Transfer GPA 3.75-4.00	\$10,000 Transfer Scholarship
Transfer GPA 3.50-3.74	\$8,000 Transfer Scholarship
Transfer GPA 3.25-3.49	\$7,000 Transfer Scholarship
Transfer GPA 3.00-3.24	\$5,000 Transfer Scholarship

### WHAT IS A TRANSFER STUDENT?

For purposes of scholarships, a transfer student is someone who has earned one or more college credits after high school graduation, but before attending WWU. This excludes credits earned during a summer session.

### TRANSFER SCHOLARSHIP FINE PRINT

- Students with 1-11 accepted college transfer credits will be awarded a Transfer Scholarship based on the cumulative high school GPA.
- Students with 12 or more accepted college transfer credits will be awarded a Transfer Scholarship if cumulative college GPA meets the GPA requirement of the Transfer Scholarship.
- Do not apply toward summer school tuition.
- Are disbursed 1/3 each quarter.
- Are prorated if registered for less than 12 hours; not valid for less than 6.
- Recipients must **meet SAPP requirements** for a renewable Transfer Scholarship.
- Transfer students are eligible for a maximum of four years of Transfer Scholarship or until they have met the maximum number of hours allowed by the Satisfactory Academic Progress Policy.
- Transfer students who have a break in WWU residency for one quarter or more and attend another institution are not eligible for reinstatement of the Transfer Scholarship. (Exception: ACA program as defined by WWU policy and SM Program)
- For purposes of scholarship eligibility, students can attend another accredited institution during the summer without affecting a transfer scholarship.
- Students who attend WWU, transfer to another school (except for summer) and then return to WWU are not considered transfer students and are not eligible for this scholarship.

### FRESHMAN SCHOLARSHIPS FINE PRINT

- Academic awards require a student meet SAPP requirements.
- Are disbursed 1/3 each quarter.
- Are renewable for three additional years, or a total of 12 quarters, except for Leadership.
- Do not apply toward summer school tuition.
- Are prorated if registered for less than 12 hours; not valid for less than six.
- Are subject to change.
- Scholarships must be used within six years of starting at WWU.

## Did you know?

- WWU's average financial aid award was \$28,336.
- More and larger scholarships are available for first-time WWU freshmen than for transfer students.
- WWU awarded \$40.8M in financial aid in 2022-23.
- Scholarships are not awarded on the basis of need, and you never have to pay them back.
- Grants are need-based awards you do not have to pay back.
- Loans have to be paid back.
- Washington state has one of the highest minimum wages at \$16.28, as of January 1, 2024.
